ASSESSMENT OF FACTORS AFFECTING TO ORGANIZATIONAL PRODUCTIVITY IN PRIVATE SECTOR ORGANIZATIONS IN SRI LANKA

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ABSTRACT

he purpose of this study was to examine the productivity movements in a few selected private sector organizations (Large and Medium Sized) of Sri Lanka and to assess the factors influencing productivity in such organizations enable to offer possible conclusions upon productivity.

Present study examined the movements of productivity by means of productivity indices and assessed the factors that influencing productivity at personal interviews using five – point scaled questionnaire.

The Arithmatic mean (\bar{x}) of the responses was used as the score for each factor and the standard deviation (SD) of the responses was used to check the variability of the each factor.

Seventy eight of ten different factor areas related to Labour, capital, Material, Technology, Management, Marketing, support facilities, Socio – cultural, government policy and other factors were assessed.

It was found that a significant proportion of the performance improvement of the organization was encounted for by encouraging factors and essential factors upon productivity while a greater proportion of the performance improvement was encounted by the encouraging factors upon productivity in the private sector organizations of Sri Lanka.

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
