From Remote to Reward: Optimizing Virtual Remote Learning Opportunities to Enhance Speaking Skills

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Abstract - Virtual platforms and remote learning have become increasingly popular all over the world at a rapid pace nobody could think of. COVID-19 pandemic has been the sole reason for the above-mentioned paradigm shift, which no one could escape from.
