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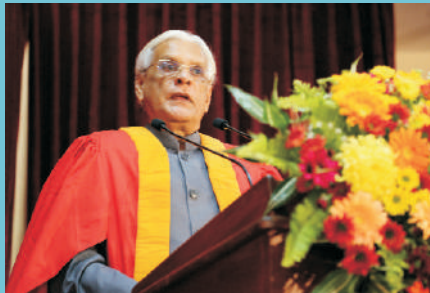

The 16th General Convocation of the Rajarata University of Sri Lanka was held on 27th May 2016 at the University premises Mihintale. Global Health's Social Innovation Think Tank Round Table

The objective of the meeting was to develop a strategic plan for the Social Innovation Think Tank and identifying areas of collaboration in global health research and leadership development with global health partners.



WHO SEARO work shop on Health Promotion

From 22nd to 24th June 2016, Dr. Manoj Participated as a temporary advisor to the WHO regional director for the WHO SEARO work shop held in Bangkok, Thailand to strengthen health promotion in achieving the Sustainable Development Goals. Dr. Manoj Fernando is the only Scientific Advisory Group member from South Asia for WHO on Health Promotion. He made one of the keynote addresses during the workshop.

Contribution to Improve A/L Education



Faculty of Applied Sciences organized a workshop for GCE Advanced Level students from schools of Anuradhapura and Polonnaruwa districts with the aim of elevating the standards of advanced Level education in the North Central Province. This workshop specifically focused on laboratory component of physics, chemistry, biology, ICT and newly introduced technology streams that students must master. The laboratories of the Faculty of Applied Sciences were opened for these students on 28th, 29th and 30th of June to learn and to get familiarize with the practical experiments and laboratory equipment recommended in the A/L syllabus under the supervision of university lecturers and students. These practical skills are vital in achieving higher grades in A/L exam but majority of students from this area face difficulties in acquiring these skills due to either poorly equipped laboratories or lack of teachers. The Faculty of Applied Sciences of Rajarata University has identified these difficulties

faced by school teachers and students and initiated this workshop in 2007 and continuing since then as one of the main community events of the faculty and university.

This year A/L workshop was conducted from 28th to 30th June. According to the organizing committee, more than 3000 school students entered university laboratories and gained firsthand experience on practical experiments in A/L syllabus and laboratory equipment as well as biological specimens. The interactive environment within the laboratories was useful in acquiring essential knowledge and skills of the practical component. This lead taken by the Faculty of Applied Sciences, to improve skills and capacities of school children, emphasizes the vital role the Rajarata University of Sri Lanka can play in the community development particularly in the North Central Province.



Collaborative Academic Agreement with York University of Canada



Rajarata University of Sri Lanka signed a collaborative academic agreement with York University of Canada on the 10th of March 2016. The signed agreement will facilitate staff and student exchange programs, collaborative research programs and development of new training programs on global health and community based health promotion approach. This will enable Rajarata University to strengthen global health component in the health promotion programs and York University to train both undergraduates and postgraduates on community based health promotion approaches.

The signing of this agreement was done as part of a Health Promotion Symposium which allowed both Rajarata and York academics to share experiences. This symposium mainly focused on community based health promotion approach and conducted from 10th to 12th March, 2016 at the Faculty of Applied Sciences.

The inaugural ceremony held with the participation of a team from the York University, Canada, Invitees from Ministry of Health, Ministry of Education and government administrators, University staff, community members and students

The key resource person of the event was Prof. Diyanath Samarasinghe who is also the advisor for the Health Promotion program. Dr. Manoj Fernando and Mr. Duminda Guruge were the other resource persons from Rajarata University. The team from the York University, Canada included Professor Harvey A. Skinner, Dean of the Faculty of Health, Professor Arun Chockalingam, Professor & Special Advisor on Global Health to the Dean of Faculty of Health, Professor Mary E. Wiktorowicz, Associate Dean for Community and Global Health of Faculty of Health and Professor F. Beryl Pilkington, Program Director, Global Health of Faculty of Health

The symposium included presentations of community members who are from the areas where health promotion programs are currently being conducted, presentations of students, academic staff of Health promotion division and delegates from York University. The program of the last day of symposium included visits to communities where all academics could witness the improvements of community members following community based health promotion programs.

Health Promotion Colloquium 2016

The Health Promotion Division of the Faculty of Applied Sciences, Rajarata University of Sri Lanka with the collaboration of Plan International Sri Lanka organized a Health Promotion Colloquium for a team of staff members from Plan International China and Plan International Sri Lanka. The Asia Regional Health Promotion Colloquium conducted in 2014 and the success of child health programs conducted by the Plan International Sri Lanka with the Health Promotion Division have been the key for Plan International to recognize 'Health Promotion' as a key concept for community development. Hence, Dr Helen Louise Taylor, Maternal Newborn Child Adolescent Health and Nutrition Advisor of the Plan-International Asia Region requested for health promotion training for a team from the Plan International China.

Prof. Diyanath Samarasinghe facilitated the training as the Consultant where Mr. Duminda Guruge and Dr. Manoj Fernando of the Health Promotion Division were the main facilitators. The colloquium basically focused on applying community based health

promotion for child wellbeing and both Sri Lankan and the Chinese groups were supported to formulate their own action plans for their settings on improving child wellbeing and development. The training was conducted from 24th to 28th May, 2016 at the Rajarata University of Sri Lanka. In addition to the class room sessions, community presentations and field visits were incorporated in the training. As an international training centre on health promotion, this is the twelfth event conducted by the Health Promotion Division to share its unique health promotion model to the international community.



Workshop on “Promoting Industrial Training”

A workshop on Promoting Industrial Training was held on 3rd March 2016 at the faculty of Applied Sciences, Rajarata University of Sri Lanka. About 100 students of the faculty actively participated in this oneday workshop in which the importance of industrial training to bridge the gap between the academia and the industry was emphasized. This was funded by the Quality and Innovation Grant (QIG) of the Department of Physical Sciences of the faculty of Applied Sciences.

Two senior executives from Lanka Walltiles PLC and Lanka tiles PLC participated as resource persons in the workshop, shared their wealth of knowledge and expertise with the students and the staff. This workshop gave a green light on the prospective industrial training opportunities for students of the faculty in their world renowned company. This will be a great opportunity; in particular, for students who wish to get an industrial training in the fields of Chemistry, Physics and Mathematics.



Department of Biological Sciences Takes Lead in Conserving Nature Reserve



Biodiversity (flora and fauna) survey of the C o c k - Abbey forest reserve in Horowupothana was initiated by a team led by Dr Sriyani Wickramasinghe of the Biological Department of the Faculty of Applied Sciences. Department of Wildlife Conservation and the Department of Forestry support this project. The aim of the survey is to conserve this invaluable reserve for future generations by securing the biodiversity. This conversation project from the Department of Biological Sciences also provides an opportunity for students of the Faculty of Applied Sciences to conduct field activities to support components of their academic programs in the reserve that serves as a rich outdoor laboratory.

“Wasa Wisu Nati Ratak”

In parallel to the 'Wasa Wisu Nati Ratak' national program (A country free from poisonous substances), to ensure the chemical-free farming and food in the country within the next three years, a national exhibition was organized in the BMICH by the Strategic Enterprise Management Agency (SEMA) from 6th to 8th March, 2016. On the invitation of SEMA, the Health Promotion Division of the Faculty of Applied Sciences successfully conducted an exhibition stall in this national exhibition. The exhibition stall educated general public and provided information and guidance on general well being while paying special attention in to nutrition, commercial and media influence on dietary practices, attitudes related to food purchasing, chemical free farming in aspects of *sustainable, self-sufficient communities* and prevention of tobacco smoking while emphasizing the negative impacts of tobacco farming.



A large crowd including politicians, media, religious leaders, school children and civil society members visited the exhibition stall where health promotion undergraduates received supportive and encouraging comments from both general public and influential persons. The health promotion exhibition stall could generate a public dialogue at this forum where the presidents' office appreciated the stall despite of the different influences of some multinational companies and industries. This exhibition has been an opportunity for the health promotion undergraduate students to receive attention of different organizations in which they have been offered a funding support for future awareness activities focusing school students on national scale.

Ideamart Outreach



Ideamart outreach in Rajarata University was held at the Faculty of Applied Sciences auditorium on 5th March 2016. Seven young Ideamart members visited the faculty to share their knowledge and conduct a session to introduce Ideamart platform and also demonstrate how to develop simple applications using the platform. Art Therapy; A new approach of minimizing the impact of psychological trauma to children.



Children are greatly vulnerable to psychological trauma following disasters. Sadly it is underestimated and not prioritized during disaster management. Scientific evidence suggests that neglecting the psychological impact can lead to aggregation of stress and can even progress to mental disorders such as depression.



Thabbowa, a rural area in Puttlam District was affected by floods during the heavy rain fall last month. Families were displaced, property was lost and people had to be evacuated by boats or helicopters as the flood level suddenly had risen at night. This was a terrifying experience for children in the affected families. Moreover, even children who were not directly affected by the floods had experienced stress either by hearing experiences of their friends and relatives or due to exposure through media.

An art therapy programme focusing on these children was conducted by Dr. Gayani Amarasinghe, a lecturer of department of community medicine and medical students. The Programme was set in a medical camp for flood affected people, organized by a community organization; Manussakama.

Children coming for the medical camp were invited to a common area where they were provided with crayons and papers for arts creation. Members of the intervention team interacted with each child at the beginning and while drawing and drawing was channeled in a way to give children space to explore the traumatic experiences they had. This also provided relaxation and a sense of resuming routines activities, which are proven to be beneficial for recovery. Parents were also involved, helping them to support their children through the disaster.

Health camp for flood refugees at Thabbowa

Sri Lanka faced an unexpected flood disaster from the heavy rain which fell over many districts during the last months of May and June. It converted many people into refugees by a few seconds or hours. So as a step of humanity the Department of Community Medicine of Faculty of medicine of Rajarata University launched a health campaign at the Thabbowa refugee camp with the main aim of preventing and minimizing adverse post disaster consequences with regard to health. The campaign was guided by Professor Suneth Agampodi, the head of the Department of Community Medicine, and strengthened by the rest of the department staff and medical students.

On that day free medical consultation was provided with medications and counseling done on sanitation which would be a huge step in the prevention of communicable diseases in the post disaster period.



“Jeevaka Yathra”

“Jeevakayathra” annual health camp has been conducted by Medical Students Union of Faculty of medicine and Allied Sciences in front of the Ruwanweliseya premises for the 6th consecutive time, targeting pilgrims visiting the sacred city on 18th and 19th June 2016. We were able to treat around 3500 patients with our medical & eye clinics, emergency treatment unit, surgical unit, specialist consultation and pharmacy

World Health Assembly



The World Health Assembly is the decision-making body of WHO. It is attended by delegations from all WHO Member States and focuses on a specific health agenda prepared by the Executive Board. The main functions of the World Health Assembly are to determine the policies of the Organization, appoint the Director-General, supervise financial policies, and review and approve the proposed programme budget. The Health Assembly is held annually in Geneva, Switzerland. Around 3500 delegates from WHO's 194 Member States – including a large proportion of the world's health ministers attended the WHA, from 23rd to 28th May 2016. This year's theme of WHA was “Transforming our world: the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development” and began a discussion on WHO reform.

Prof. Suneth Agampodi participated in WHA 2016 as a delegate from World Federation of Public Health Associations. This was a part of 5th year reunion of Inter Academy Medical Panel Young Physician Leaders (YPL) programme. In 2012 he was nominated as the YPL from Sri Lanka.

Implementation Researches

Implementation Research (IR), still an emerging and unknown field for many researches. IR is kind of research which was developed to solve implementation problems. It acts in real field setting and addresses practical implementation obstacles. The first IR training programme in Sri Lanka was launched in 2016 by Department of Community Medicine, Faculty of Medicine, Rajarata University. It was initiated through WHO Research and Training in Tropical Diseases (TDR) small grant scheme. The department offered full time scholarships for the participants and the programme was based on WHO IR training manual.

35 health care workers from different categories were present at the initial workshop and they included health administrators at provincial and district level, consultants representing policy making bodies or district level implementers, other health care providers and seven other different categories of healthcare professionals. Participants were rearranged into six groups. Prof. Suneth Agampodi, Prof. Sisira Siribaddana, Dr. Thilini Agsmpodi, Dr. Nuwan Wickramasinghe, Dr. Buddhika Wijerathne were present as resource personnel. This one day workshop was held on 26th January 2016.

The introductory workshop mainly focused on conceptualization of IR. Almost all of them were not aware what IR is. After giving a detailed account on IR research, ethics was also discussed. These were interactive sessions. Participants were provided with WHO TDR implementation research toolkit for reference purposes. At the end of the sessions participant groups were given the task to select a research topic to work on during the training period. They were encouraged to select a topic that can identify implementation bottlenecks especially in their own settings.

The second step of the IRTP was on proposal development held as a five days residential workshop from 8th to 12th February 2016. Each group developed their own research proposal step by step and resource personals guided them along the way. Sessions included lectures, discussions and interactive activities. A special workshop on Mendeley was also conducted. Participants were encouraged to work as groups, counteract with other groups with the help of Trello online platform. At the end of the five days workshop, proposals were finalized including relevant forms of the studies such as questionnaires, consent forms, participation information leaflets.

Ethical training one day workshop was held on 19th of February 2016 at Faculty of Medicine and Allied Sciences, Rajarata University of Sri Lanka, Saliyapura, Anuradhapura. As the final step of preparing the project proposal participants completed ethical review committee (ERC) application forms for their proposed implementation studies. ERC applications were formatted as guided by the ERC committee, Faculty of Medicine, Rajarata University. They were educated on the format of the ERC application form and other documents such as questionnaires, participation information leaflets, consent forms and the ethical part of them.

Qualitative methods one day workshop of IRTP was held on 30th of March 2016 at Rajarata Hotel, Anuradhapura. This workshop was conducted as requested by most of the participants. Most of the groups have a qualitative component in their researches and this workshop guided them to perform a comprehensive qualitative study. Workshop composed of lectures and interactive sessions. In the latter part of the workshop groups were made to prepare tentative qualitative interviewer guides and they presented their own interviews.

Currently all groups are collecting data and even before analyzing they have been able to identify important bottlenecks in implementation. There will be data analyzing workshop after teams have completed the data collection and then dissemination sessions will be held with the participation of relevant stakeholders. The ultimate aim of the programme is to disseminate the knowledge and bring out improvement in healthcare delivery.

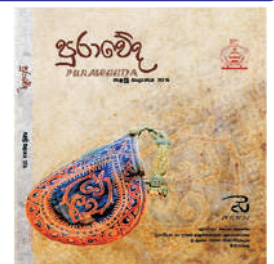
Undergraduate Research

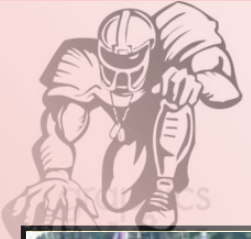
